# Notice of Race

### **1. RULES**

- 1.1 Races will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 Australian Sailing (AS) 2017-2020 Special Regulations, Part 2 For Off The Beach Boats apply.
- 1.3 [DP] Adequate covered footwear must be worn at all times and that approved life jackets or buoyancy vests are worn by all skippers and crew whilst afloat.
- 1.4 Racing Rules will be changed as follows:
  - Rule 26: Starting Races (Timing)
  - Rule 27.1: Actions before the Starting Signal
  - Rule 29.2: General Recalls (Restarting)
  - Rule 32: Shortening Course
  - Rule 35: Time Limit
  - Rule 62.2: Redress
  - Rule 66: Reopening a Hearing
  - Rule A2: Scoring
  - Rule A4 & A5: Low Point System (Time Limits)

Changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules.

### **2. ELIGIBILITY**

Racing is open to all monohull off-the-beach boats up to 5.5 metres in overall length.

Competitors must register for the regatta and be either:

- I. a full member of either Albert Sailing Club or Albert Park Yacht Club.
- II. a winter season associate of Albert Sailing Club
- III. a visiting member from another club who registers for the regatta and pays the entry fee.

### **3. FEES**

For Albert Sailing Club full year members and Albert Park Yacht Club full members the regatta entry fee is incorporated in member subscriptions.

Visitors (Including Albert Sailing Club Winter Season Associate)

Adult skipper for full regatta :  
\$35 online or \$45 for late entry.

Junior skipper (under 18 years) for full regatta:  
\$25 online or \$35 for late entry

One day Adult or Junior skipper \$20

No entry fees apply for crews.

#### **4. ENTRY and SCHEDULE**

##### **4.1 Entry Registration:**

- On-line through the Regatta Entry site (preferred) until 11pm Thursday 20th June 2019 <http://albertsc.org.au/index.php/racing/2019-asc-winter-regatta/> Secure Credit Card or Paypal account payment on-line is preferred. Alternatively register online then make Cheque/Cash payment at the Regatta registration desk on day one of the regatta.
- Late Entries will be accepted (Cheque/Cash only), Registration Updates and on-line Cheque/Cash payments at the registration desk upstairs in the ASC clubhouse :
  - Saturday 22 June from 11am to 12.30pm.
  - Sunday 23 June from 8.30am to 9.30am or 90 minutes before scheduled race start for any Sunday only entrants.

Where entry and payment is made on-line for a boat being sailed by adult(s) there is no need to attend the Regatta Registration desk upon arrival unless there is a change in entry details.

Where skipper and/or crew is under 18 years of age a Parent Permission Form, downloaded from website or available from the registration desk, must be signed by parent or legal guardian and presented at the registration desk before sailing.

Competitors must indicate their intention to sail for each racing session by signing on as a starter on the Sign On sheets provided before each session in the Sign On/ Sign Off area behind the club foyer downstairs.

##### **4.2 Schedule:**

The regatta will consist of a series of races of short course format across three sessions:

- **Session 1:** pm Saturday 22 June. First warning signal 1342 hrs with an information session approximately at 1300 Subsequent races in the session will commence as soon as practical after all boats in a division have finished the race.
- **Session 2:** am Sunday 23 June. First warning signal 1012 hrs with a brief information session at 0930. Subsequent races in the session will commence as soon as practical after all boats in a division have finished the race.
- **Session 3:** pm on Sunday 23 June. The time for the first warning signal will be posted after all boats have completed session 2, and will allow for a short lunch break. A brief information session may be held at least 30 minutes prior to the first warning signal.

Subsequent races in the session will commence as soon as practical after all boats in a division have finished the race. No races will be started later than 1530 on Sunday 23 June 2019.

## **5. MEASUREMENTS:**

All boats need to comply with their class measurement rules. Any discrepancies shall be notified in writing to the Race Officer prior to the Information Session before the first racing session for which the discrepancies apply. Any allegations of measurement deficiencies shall be by means of a protest.

Only one sail and hull shall be used during the regatta. These items may only be replaced after damage during this regatta and only after approval from race committee.

## **6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:**

The Regatta Sailing Instructions shall be displayed on the Official Race Noticeboard. Copies will be available on the ASC internet website at least 5 days prior to the Regatta and from the Regatta Registration desk.

## **7. VENUE**

Club racing takes place on Albert Park Lake, South Melbourne.

## **8. THE COURSES**

Courses shall be determined by the Race Officer, as provided in the Sailing Instructions.

## **9. SCORING**

- I. Multiple races are scheduled at the Race Officer's discretion, of which three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- II. When five (5) or less races are completed a boat's series score shall be the total of all her race scores. This changes rule A2.
- III. When six (6) or more races are completed each boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

## **10. SUPPORT BOATS**

Support boats other than club patrol boats, are restricted due to the confined nature of the sailing course areas. Use of any support boats is at the discretion of the Race Officer, and requires Race Officer approval before the warning signal for a Session. Support boats shall comply with Parks Victoria regulations on use of power craft on Albert Park Lake.

## **11. PRIZES:**

- I. A Regatta Champion trophy will be awarded on class of boat yardstick corrected time. Boats sailing across all sessions in the regatta are eligible for this trophy as follows:
  - a. 1<sup>st</sup> Overall Senior
  - b. 1<sup>st</sup> Overall Junior, (Based on applicable class age limits)
- II. Trophies for classes of boat will be awarded based on the average number of entrants per race across all sessions in the regatta.

a. Average number of class entrants per race	Trophies Awarded
b. Less than three	None
c. Three to Five	First Place on line honours
d. Six to Nine	First & Second Place Line Honours

- e. Ten or more First, Second & Third Line Honours  
Additional trophies may be given at the discretion of the Race Committee.

## **12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4. Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

## **13. INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of AUD\$5,000,000.
